



ADA Title II Updates

- 2023 Dear Colleague Letter
- April 2024: Updates to <u>Title II the ADA</u>
- Fact Sheet: New Rule is a paradigm shift
 - Design for inclusivity from the start versus making accommodations and remediation if/when needed
 - Applies to everyone covered under the Title II of the ADA (SUNY faculty, staff, students, public visitors)
- Deadline is April 2026 for most SUNY campuses







- Universal Design for Learning
 - creating a more inclusive learning environment for students with disabilities by eliminating barriers to learning during the design process
- SUNY Universal Design for Learning Project
 - Began in 2021 to provide free professional development to SUNY faculty and instructional designers in the UDL framework
 - Funded through the Office of Student Success
 - Courses/workshops through the SUNY CPD
 - Included in Brightspace training for faculty



SUNY's IIE invests, innovates, scales, and reinvests in instruction that delivers outcomes





Outside View of the IIE against National Trends and Exemplars

Strengths

- Connected: The system connects all types of campuses, from community colleges to research universities
- System-wide Partners: Strong system-wide partners and shared services, like learning management systems and help desks, support academic innovation
- Recent Successes: There are recent successes, such as OER initiatives, with potential for more
- Large Faculty Base: The large faculty base offers vast capacity for innovation
- Established Infrastructure: Established organizational infrastructure supports innovation, including CIT and COPs focused on these issues
- Major new Al investments by state: Major new Al investments create enhanced enabling conditions

Opportunity areas

- Slow Policy-making: Policy-making process is lengthy potentially limiting speed of innovation and scaling
- Funding Gap: There is a gap in next-level funding for promising innovation pre-scale and beyond initial trials
- Financial variability: Financial instability and variability across campuses limits ability to champion and scale innovation
- Competition: Competition between campuses can preclude collaboration and uptake of innovation
- Limited Philanthropy: Limited philanthropic engagement on these issues relative to the system's scale limits funding opportunities
- Constrained Integration: Instructional innovation is sometimes at margins rather than being integrated into broader campus operations and strategies



Focus for 2025-2026

- Assess current structures, events, and roles to
 - Bring more intentionality to engagements with stakeholders
 - Connect IIE activities for greater impact and scale
 - Promote more cross-campus collaborations
- Stakeholder Engagement to
 - Determine priorities for upcoming investments
 - Shape focus for the Innovative Instruction Research Council
- Identify opportunities for external funding to
 - Assess and demonstrate impact (ROI)
- Evolve our data infrastructure to
 - · Improve reporting internally
 - Tell our impact story
