Evaluate all content for conformance to the WCAG 2.1 AA standards.	Determine reasonable accommodations for students with disabilities.	Collaborate with vendors of educational tools and resources.	Maintain the learning management system, student portals and other infrastructure related to online course activities.	Develop content for university courses with relevant subject matter experts.	Implement a student's approved accommodations upon receipt of an accommodation memo.
Provide expert consultation & advice regarding any remediation needed to conform to the WCAG 2.1 AA standards.	Notify faculty of a student's approved accommodations.	Ensure the accessibility team has appropriate credentials and access to effectively evaluate tools and content being considered for inclusion in course activities.	Collaborate with accessibility to ensure internally developed tools are built with accessibility in mind and evaluated on a regular schedule.	Integrate accessibility features into the design of all university coursework.	Consult with disability services regarding a student's need for accommodations.
Develop and deliver professional development opportunities for faculty and staff related to accessibility.	Consult with faculty and relevant functional office staff regarding the implementation of a student's approved accommodations.	Facilitate communication between instructional design, accessibility team and vendors regarding concerns about accessibility.	Consult with accessibility and disability services on systems used to identify students with disabilities and track their usage of accommodations.	Review all new and revised university courses for conformance with the following accessibility criteria:	Participate in an annual accessibility training.
Collaborate with marketing and IT to ensure accessibility of public website, learning management system and other technological infrastructure.	Develop and deliver professional development related to accommodations and working with students with disabilities.	Consult with instructional design and vendors on available integration options to include the tool or resource in the course.	Partner with accessibility and marketing to ensure the university's public facing website and resources are accessible to all audiences.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All videos have captions, transcripts and, if needed, audio description;</li> <li>• All audio content has transcripts;</li> <li>• All PDFs and other documents are accessible;</li> <li>• All images have appropriate alternative text; and</li> <li>• All links posted in the course are descriptive.</li> </ul>	Ensure that the following accessibility criteria are met for all content posted in the course: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Transcripts and/or captions are available for videos &amp; audio;</li> <li>• Accessible PDFs &amp; other documents;</li> <li>• All images have appropriate alternative text; and</li> <li>• Descriptive hyperlinks are used.</li> </ul>
Consult with legal and procurement on contract language and provisions related to accessibility.	Collaborate with the accessibility team to review course roster lists to determine if students with approved disabilities are enrolled to determine accessibility needs.	Develop multimedia according to accessibility guidelines for courses.			

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
