The year 2024 will be partially remembered as a year for when the world truly opened back up from the COVID restrictions. The SUNY Online Summit returned in-person, to New York City for the first time since the pandemic. SUNY's overall enrollments increased for the second year in a row. Record funding from Governor Kathy Hochul and the New York State legislature ushered in new, historic projects like Empire AI and the Digital Transformation Project. Chancellor John B. King, Jr. provided guidance and inspiration to keep us focused on SUNY's four pillars of student success, research and scholarship, DEI, and economic development and upward mobility.

A personal highlight for me in 2024 was being able to visit campuses as part of our Digital Learning Environment (DLE) listening tour. Because the bulk of the DLE implementation was during COVID, it was amazingly done without any face-to-face meetings or campus visits. Now that everyone has Brightspace in production, we are looking at how to really leverage the platform to support both System Administration and campus initiatives and goals. As part of that effort, we offered every campus the opportunity for a face-to-face campus visit. This helped us understand campus priorities, what is working well, where there are still pain points, and where we need to provide more or expanded support to campuses.

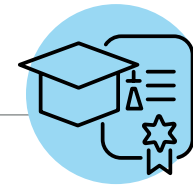

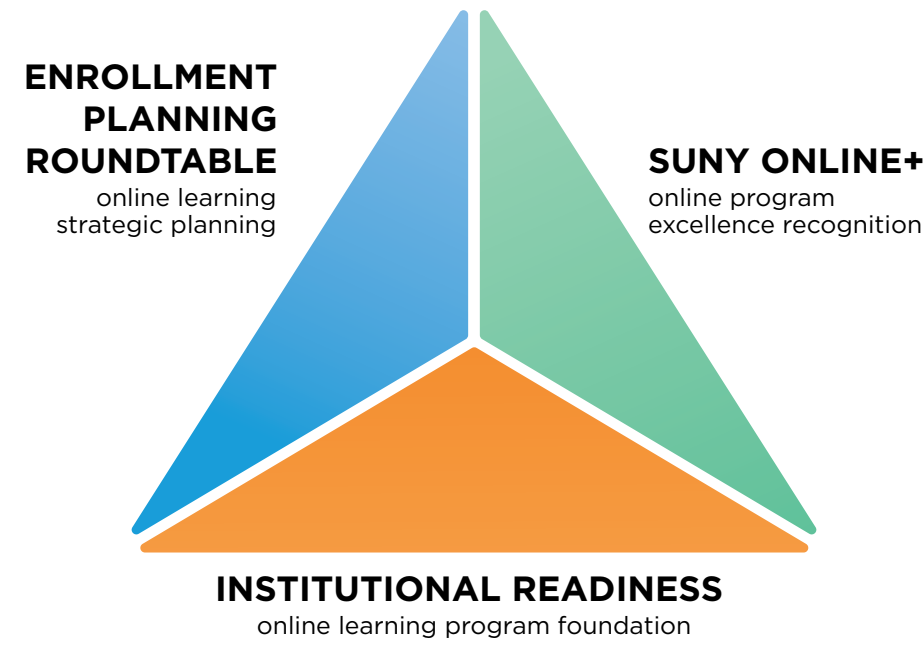

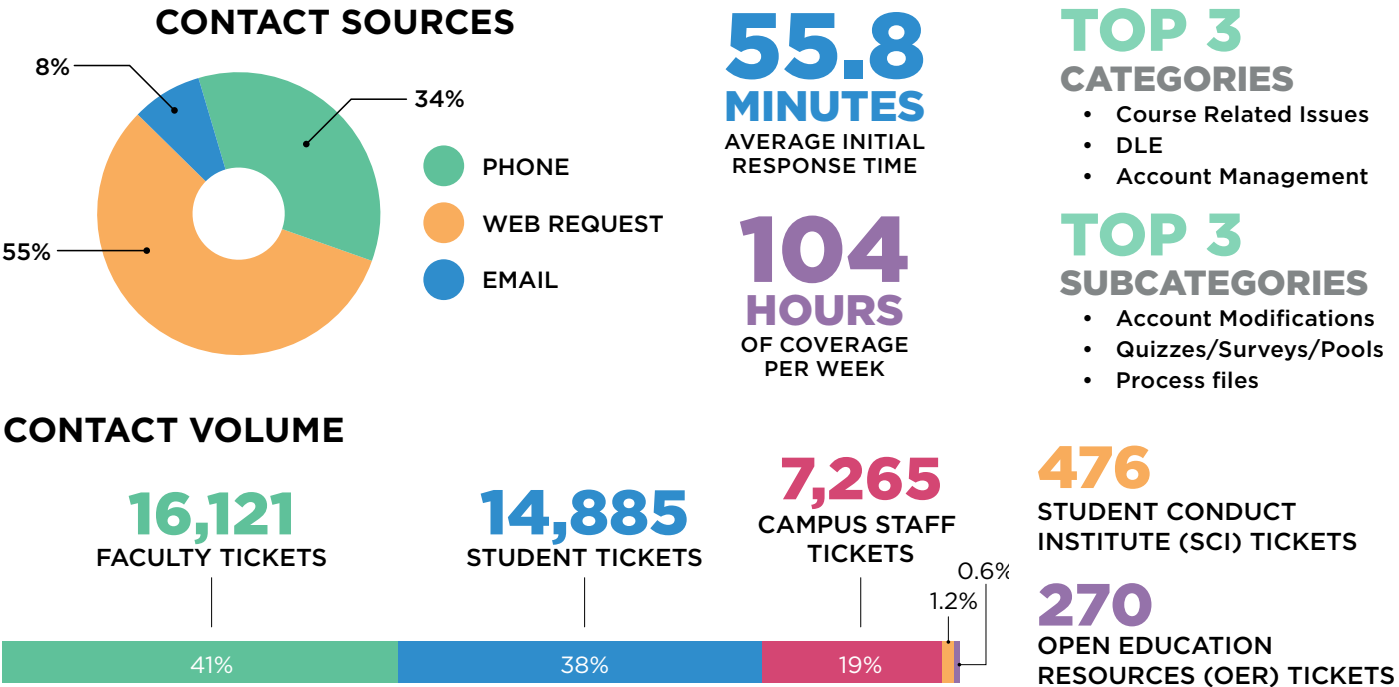

APPLICATION SERVICES

During this period, SUNY Application Services dedicated expanded resources at no additional cost to 57 campuses and institutions to support their transition to the multi-tenant Digital Learning Environment (DLE) / Brightspace environment. During this time, escalated Blackboard (legacy) administrative support continued to provide critical support for faculty and students. The end of this period also signified the completion of the DLE Implementation project so that focus could shift to operational support and expanded functionality to continue to evolve how we are utilizing the shared DLE environment for the needs of all SUNY campuses.

SUNY DLE BRIGHTSPACE FUNDAMENTALS ASYNCHRONOUS MODULES

A self-paced online asynchronous course called SUNY DLE Brightspace Fundamentals Asynchronous Modules was designed and implemented to provide faculty the opportunity to become familiar with the Brightspace Learning Management System which is at the heart of the SUNY Digital Learning Environment (DLE). This ongoing course leads faculty through the basics of Brightspace or they can select just the modules they want to learn more about.

SUNY Online Teaching continues to provide support, resources, and models for SUNY campuses and beyond for online teaching and learning. Online

learning faculty from across SUNY and around the world visit the SUNY Online Teaching website.

SUNY Online Teaching also supports Communities of Practice. And it fosters and shares effective online practices by faculty, as well as confers awards for some of those effective online practices. Annually the Effective Online Practices Awards recognize outstanding online teaching practitioners from across SUNY.



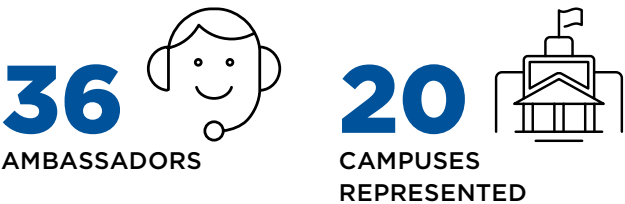
A notable collaboration with the SUNY Collaborative for Online International Learning (COIL), SUNY Maritime College, Nassau Community College, SUNY Oneonta, and Universidad Católica Andrés Bello in Venezuela led to the development of COIL+OSCQR standards. These standards support Virtual Exchange (VE) and intercultural online learning experiences and have been incorporated into a COIL version of the OSCQR rubric, available in both English and Spanish. This effort was recognized with the WCET Outstanding Work (WOW) award in Fall 2024.



A formal OSCQR webinar and certification process was launched in Fall 2024. The SUNY Online Course Quality Review (OSCQR) Webinar & Certification is intended to recognize existing expertise, and train and certify online instructional designers, faculty, and campuses in the use of OSCQR to address online course quality and to prepare SUNY campuses for larger-scale systematic online course quality initiatives.

An outcome of the OSCQR Certification process was an in-depth collaboration between SUNY Online and SUNY Adirondack that resulted in the certification of several online faculty fellows as OSCQR peer reviewers, further embedding quality standards within the institution. Doris Ostrander, Coordinator of the Teaching and Learning Collaborative at SUNY Adirondack, stated, "SUNY Online Teaching's expertise empowered our first cohort of faculty fellows to self-assess, review each other's courses, and achieve certification as OSCQR reviewers. This meaningful collaboration has not only strengthened our fellowship program but also enhanced our capacity to maintain high standards in online course design and quality."

> SUPPORTING ONLINE STUDENTS

SUNY Online continues to offer a range of resources to enhance campuses' online student support efforts. These resources include the Online Student Success Collaborative Community of Practice, the Online Student Support Certificate courses offered through SUNY's Center for Professional Development, and the SUNY Online Student Success Inventory—an online student onboarding survey available to all campuses at no cost.

ONLINE STUDENT SUCCESS COLLABORATIVE

The Online Student Success Collaborative Community of Practice was established with the objective of sharing, developing, and promoting scalable best practices for online student support and success initiatives, while also disseminating the outcomes of these efforts within the SUNY community. This community provides opportunities for engagement among SUNY colleagues through monthly virtual meetings and the Viva Engage platform. The Online Student Success Collaborative Community of Practice currently comprises 129 members representing 33 SUNY campuses. This diverse group includes academic advisors, success coaches, instructional designers, directors of online learning, online program chairs, technology support staff, and individuals in various other roles. New members are welcome.

"Being part of the Online Student Success Collaborative Community of Practice offers invaluable benefits to our campus, such as gaining insights into innovative strategies other campuses use to support their students, which can spark new ideas for our own initiatives. For example, we have seen many excellent examples of student orientation, onboarding processes, outreach, and ongoing messaging. ONLINE STUDENT SUPPORT CERTIFICATE

The Online Student Support Certificate program, offered in partnership the SUNY Center for Professional Development (CPD), equips staff, faculty, and campus leadership with strategies and best practices aimed at enhancing student success in online learning environments. Participants will explore the necessity for campus workflows and perspectives to acknowledge the unique needs and specific challenges faced by online students, as well as the opportunities available to them.

The overarching goal is to empower participants to reimagine and effectively deliver student services and resources that are tailored to meet the needs of online learners.

SUNY ONLINE STUDENT SUCCESS INVENTORY (SOSSI)

Proactively addressing gaps in online student preparation is essential for enhancing academic success. The SUNY Online Student Success Inventory (SOSSI) is a valuable tool designed to evaluate both strengths and weaknesses in various behavioral and attitudinal domains pertinent to online learning. Adopted across SUNY undergraduate and graduate programs, the SOSSI offers actionable insights that enable student support staff on campuses to effectively tailor their support services. The SOSSI is provided at no cost to campuses.

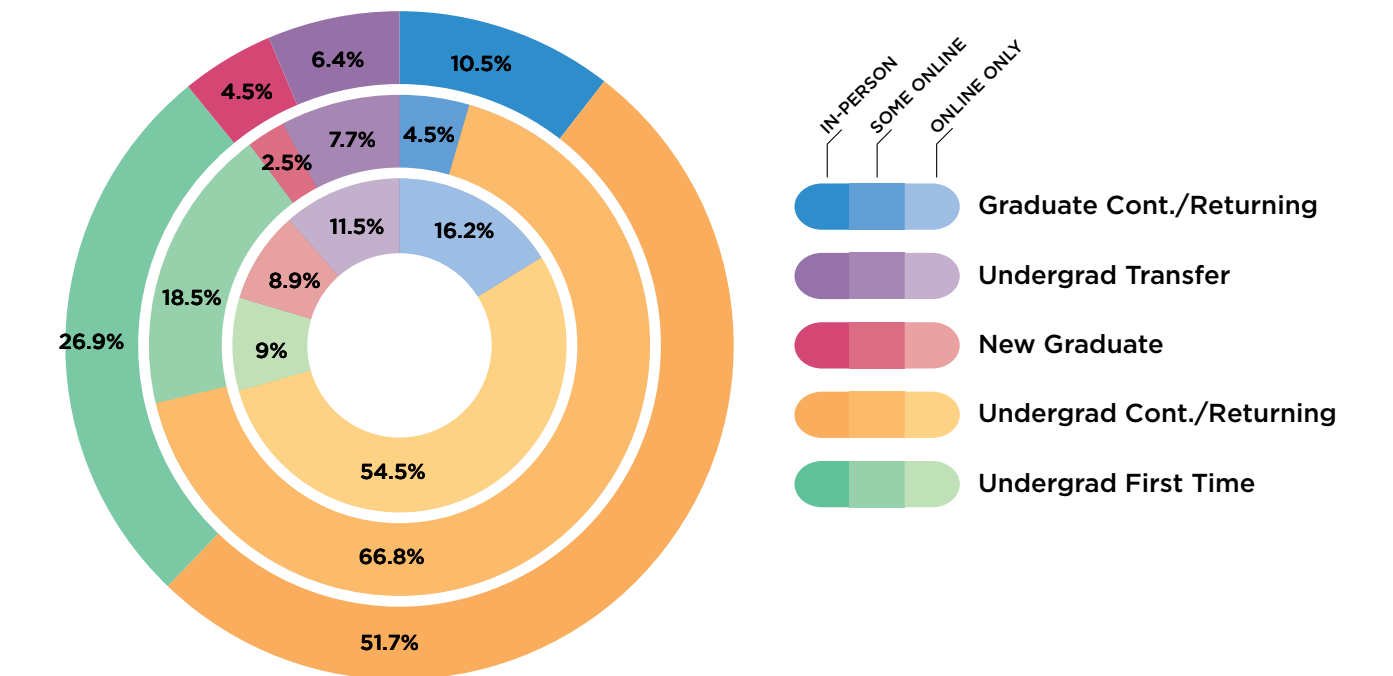

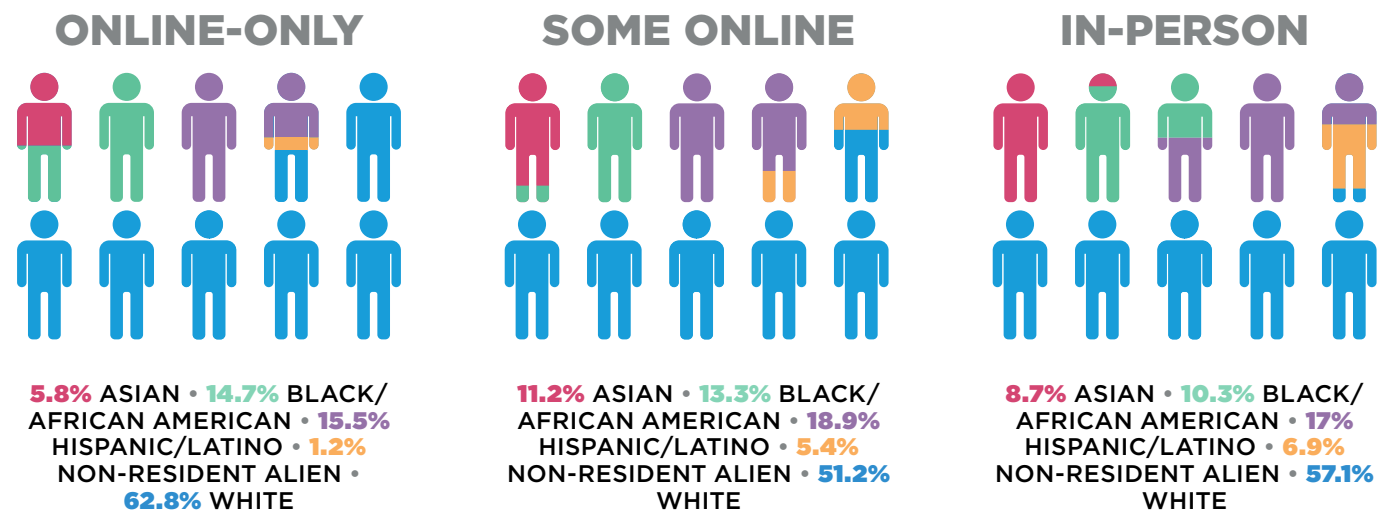
VARIOUS DEMOGRAPHICS OF STUDENTS TAKING COURSES IN DIFFERENT MODALITIES
