



Formulating Research Topics and Questions

All research is based on questions. What, when, where, who and why are all questions that will determine our informational needs. Research will provide us with answers, but it may also produce new questions. These questions often arise when we become curious or when our research leads to disconnects (missing information). Sometimes, we simply find a topic to be of interest and we wish to pursue it further. Our need to fill in the blanks and fulfill our curiosities is what allows for the continuation and expansion of knowledge.

After viewing the instructional videos provided, develop a research question that is both viable and appropriate for a 3-5-page research paper. Your question or topic must pertain to this week's chapter readings (Capital & Labor and The West) and must meet the criteria discussed in the videos.

Tell me what information in the chapter readings led you to formulate your topic or question. How is your topic or question viable and appropriate for a 3-5-page research paper? Please reference the chapters and videos.

PLEASE DO NOT RESEARCH YOUR TOPIC OR QUESTION! You are only formulating a research question at this point. The purpose of this assignment is to become proficient in developing research topics and questions for academic research.

NOTE: You are not required to use your topic or question for the actual research paper assignment (due May 6), but you must apply the same principles when you begin formulating those topics and questions.

Please submit your assignment as a 2-3 paragraph Word Document.
